

In the Navy Reserve, military life doesn't have to be all in or all out. You can achieve the best of both worlds, serving your country alongside full-time Sailors as you continue your life in the civilian world.

BENEFITS

As a NAVET (Navy Veteran) or OSVET (Other Service Veteran), you will likely resume at your previous rate or rank.

BONUS

Joining the Reserve could earn you a potential affiliation bonus of \$5,000 to \$20,000.

PAY


Navy Reservists are paid for four days of Active Duty for only two days of work. You'll have the opportunity to work as a professional in fields ranging from aviation to engineering, intel to admin.

HEALTH INSURANCE

You'll be eligible for TRICARE Reserve Select® medical insurance with low monthly premiums for you and your family.

RETIREMENT

Generous benefits, plus an optional, tax-deferred Thrift Savings Plan to help you prepare and plan for retirement.





PURSUE YOUR GOALS. DEFEND OURS.

From Construction to Cryptology. Health Care to Chaplaincy. Law Enforcement to Office Administration. Reservist training provides or refines cutting-edge skills to help you succeed in a civilian or military career. If you're interested in areas outside of your specialty, you might qualify to cross-train in a new field.

BASIC OBLIGATIONS

Serve a minimum of one weekend per month
(drilling), plus two weeks a year (annual training).





DRILLING

Typically, you'll train near your home for 16 hours each month at one of the [hundreds of training sites that span the U.S.](#)

As a Reservist, you'll often have the same duties as your active duty counterparts. Specific responsibilities depend on your occupational specialty, as well as whether you're an Enlisted Sailor or a Commissioned Officer.

FLEXIBLE DRILLING

If your civilian career makes weekend service difficult, flexible drilling options allow you to serve on weekdays. Or, you can choose to fulfill your annual commitment in a single extended mission.



ANNUAL TRAINING

For at least two weeks each year, you'll take part in advanced training that can take you across the U.S. or around the globe.

This is usually a command exercise with your drilling Reserve detachment. However, you may also have an opportunity to participate in a humanitarian outreach effort or pursue an independent assignment to broaden your experience.



SERVICE COMMITMENT

Obligations in the Navy Reserve range from two to eight years, with opportunities for additional service and pay.

Since you've already served in the military, you're not required to attend boot camp.



OFFICER TRAINING

Officers entering the Reserve need to attend [Direct Commission Officer \(DCO\) School](#). Depending on your career field, you may also attend additional specialty schooling.



DEPLOYMENT DEFERMENT

Reservists can potentially be deployed during service. There is no formula for determining who will deploy or when, where or for how long.

However, as a NAVET or OSVET, you can receive a guaranteed initial deployment deferment when you join the Navy Reserve.

RECEIVE A TWO-YEAR INVOLUNTARY MOBILIZATION DEFERMENT

if you join the Reserve 0–6 months after release from active duty.

RECEIVE A ONE-YEAR INVOLUNTARY MOBILIZATION DEFERMENT

if you join the Reserve 7+ months after release from active duty.



ENTRY PROCESS

Joining the Navy Reserve is simple and seamless.

As a NAVET or OSVET, you must be able to complete 20 years of service by age 60.

Other eligibility and options depend on a variety of factors. Your local recruiter can answer questions about your specific situation.
