Civil Engineer Corps (CEC) Officers are responsible for leading the Seabees – the Navy and Marine Corps military construction force. The Navy and Navy Reserve Construction Battalions – the Seabees – provide military construction support to Navy, Marine Corps and other forces during military operations.

They construct base facilities and conduct defensive operations as well. Seabees conduct specialized construction operations such as water well drilling, build runways and conduct battle damage repair. In addition to standard steel, wood, masonry and concrete construction Seabees work and defend themselves while building facilities outside of their base camps.

In times of disaster or emergency, Seabees are often among the first responders, ready to help restore necessary services and shelter. Seabees also conduct Humanitarian Assistance and Disaster Relief at home and around the world.

Active Duty CEC Officers are responsible for managing the construction and maintenance of Navy and Marine Corps shore facilities. CEC Officers also manage a large variety of projects including the building of schools, roads, parks, hospitals, factories, research centers, utility systems, harbors and airports worldwide. They also manage timberland, oil and mineral deposits under Navy auspices.





DIRECT COMMISSION OPPORTUNITIES

Get serious about your future. America's Navy Reserve Civil Engineer Corps Direct Commission Program is just what you're looking for. As a member of this elite officer corps you'll join with other professionals who are charged with the engineering, planning, construction, maintenance and management of Navy shore facilities worldwide.


QUALIFICATIONS

- College graduate with an Engineering Degree accredited by the Accreditation Board for Engineering and Technology (ABET) in Civil, Mechanical, Electrical, Construction, Industrial, Ocean, Mining or Environmental Engineering; or College graduate with a professional Architecture Degree accredited by the National Architectural accrediting Board (NAAB)
- Engineer-in-Training or Professional Engineer registration is desired
- Be at least 19 years old, but not yet 42 years old at the time of appointment (waivers beyond 42 are sometimes granted)
- Meet Navy medical and physical standards
- Be a U.S. citizen

COMPETITIVE PROFILE:

- Demonstrated performance in civilian career related to engineering or architectural design, facilities management and operations, transportation, utility systems, or construction
- Solid references regarding character, professional skills, and leadership
- Active membership in professional societies and organizations
- Grade point average (GPA) of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale
- Professional registration
